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A 20 month old male child was referred from the Paediatric Clinic for bowing of his legs. He was known to have glucose-6-phosphatase dehydrogenase deficiency (G6PD) deficiency. The developmental milestones were satisfactory. Clinical examination was normal except for bilateral genu varum of about 20 degrees. Radiograph of the lower limbs is shown above (**Panel**).

What are the typical radiological features and what is the diagnosis?
