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A previously healthy 64-year old gentleman presented with a two month history of painful blackish swelling over the left alar of nose. Apart from that, there was no nose block, anosmia, facial numbness or tenderness, no signs of any orbital, neurological or constitutional symptoms. The blackish mass (**Panel**) was noted to be fixed to the left alar of nose encroaching into left vestibule. Nasoendoscopic examination revealed no extension into the left or right nasal cavity with intact nasal septum. Contrast enhanced computer tomography of the abdomen revealed a nodular, irregular liver margin (consistent with liver cirrhosis) with three ill-defined heterogeneous enhancing liver masses with enlarged matted peri-portal, celiac, peri-pancreatic, retro-caval, aorto-caval and para-caval lymph nodes.

What is the diagnosis?
